Your annual assessments provide flood-risk management services for over 1,500 acres and nearly 100 landowners in Fairview and Troutdale. First established in 1917, the District works with other local drainage districts and partners to manage a total of 27 miles of levees, 45 miles of ditches and sloughs, and 12 pump stations along the Lower Columbia River.
